## Masters' Report



Glenmore hounds are doing very well, other than some minor ear infections, "happy tail", and Rummage having an open wound and cared for at Cambelot for twice daily treatment. Thank you Stacy Thompson for Rummage's care. Rummage is now back in the kennel. Staff have been doing mounted hound walks at several locations getting hounds fit, thank you to the Phelps', O'Donnell's and T Stewart. If you wish to join in on the mounted hound walking, please check the hunt line.

Radiographs on Ripple showed negative for puppies, however Tangent is nursing seven healthy puppies and the Masters are holding a naming contest to help defray the veterinary costs for these exciting new additions to the Glenmore kennel. More information on this is below. Bottom line is we are trying to keep our veterinary cost low but sometimes medical attention is needed.

Glenmore was invited and did a fox hunting demonstration at Expo in August. All hounds obeyed Missy Burnet and staff, making quite an impression on those attending the horse show, and we've been invited back in November. Thank you everyone who made this possible and manned our Glenmore informational table.

Paul Bryant, our tenant, has been doing a great job helping with hounds and keeping up the grounds, however we need a kennel person asap. Cub season starts September 21st, just around the corner, and it would be great if we had a person in place.

Several work days have been set up for fixture maintenance, please check with Anne Brooks or the Glenmore calendar and help prepare our fixtures for hunting, and again check the hunt line for details. Many hands make work lighter!

We recently had a kennel work day. Thank you Sara Wood, T Stewart, Meagan Brunot, Jake Arbaugh, and Stacy Thompson. Stacy and Jake worked on the apartment, Meagan weed whacked the very thick kennel runs, while Sara, T, and myself cleaned, sanitized, and prepared whelping boxes. A long metal table was cleaned, sanitized and put in the feed room area in order to treat hounds with minor injuries. ## Five horses you will almost certainly have in your lifetime...

**1. The first one**—The first lesson pony was very small pony named D.R. Sally Armstrong lunged me on this pony while teaching my sister's riding class. I was probably about 4. The pony managed to get off the lunge line somehow and took me under the arena fence back to the barn. Once under the fence, the gallop back to the barn was great fun.

**2. The one that just went wrong**—A lovely six-year-old Canadian Thoroughbred - Best moving horse I've ever sat on. This horse was sent to me by a friend in PA who had put it in professional training as a four-year-old. Unfortunately, the trainer pushed him faster than his development could handle, and he hyper-extended his left hind. We got him serviceably sound with turnout, but then the TB in him couldn't handle the moist Virginia weather. He got scratches on his hind legs, multiple vet visits, various treatments, etc and the scratches became infected, severe edema set in, and the infection eventually went septic. I had him about six months before we finally had to put him down. Such a tragic loss of an incredible athlete.

**3. The Ultimate One**—Definitely No Riff Raff, aka Sporty. I got him because he wouldn't run on the track. He turned out a year, and was extremely cold backed when we started him back in work. If you could stay on the first five minutes, he was super cool

to ride - best trot of any horse I've owned. Sporty was the ultimate because he knew who was riding him and how to behave. For me, he could be a snarky pain in the rear. For my mother, he was a dream (he knew who purchased his feed). Luanne Leonard let her kids ride him when they were tiny and he never took a mis-step. I knew he was a good one when Luanne took him for his first hunter pace. My supposedly made pony was so ornery that she switched with me. Sporty and I were a perfect match. Not only did we win more than our share in the

hunter ring together, he had personality plus. He took a nap at 10 AM every morning. If your class was going to go around that time, you had to tack up by 9:45. Once he laid down for his nap, it was impossible to get him up and you just had to scratch. After retiring from the showing, Sporty loved to fox hunt. He was always mesmerized by the hounds. Sporty and I are actually featured in one of Jim Mead's sporting photography books on fox hunting. Unfortunately, we are under the section titled "falls." Sporty would refuse jumps with photographers behind them in the show ring. I learned the hard way that he felt the same way about photographers behind coops out hunting.

**4. The one that got away**—I had too much pride to accept the hand-me-down pony Silver Angel from my sister. She won every pony equitation award around with this pony and I didn't want to be compared to her. That pony was amazing and would have taught me a lot. Instead, Becky Forbes Smith got her and they won a ton of classes together. Becky rode her great.

5. **The one that taught you the most-** Gallathee, aka Gidget. She was a Dutch Warmblood mare, and five personalities in one horse. You had to learn to ride all five versions well! She was the hardest, but took me the farthest. Together, we got through the A test in pony club, competed in just about everything from dressage to eventing, hunter classes, jumpers, and hunt seat equitation. We had our most success in equitation, and I'm forever thankful to this mare for helping me qualify for and compete successfully in the USET Show Jumping Talent Search Contest Finals East (in the days before USEF).
